Fall is upon us—the days are getting shorter, the presence of turtle nests is dwindling and hurricane season is almost over. Phew!

On September 10th, 2017, Hurricane Irma arrived affecting all of Florida in some respect. Once again, Villa Towers was spared any extensive damage, which was limited to:

- 5 to 6 trees downed
- fence sections down in two areas
- some exit lights on walkways blown down
- paint peeled off by pool area
- large amount of sand in the pool
- shutters were blown off of two units

The power was off for three days and there were some problems with our generator that is now being addressed.

Because of the power outage, all food left in refrigerators and freezers must be discarded. Please arrange for this to be done if you have not already done so.

Luckily there were no flooding or beach erosion issues and our beach is actually better than ever with additional dunes being created. This can only help us in our attempt to get an improved flood zone designation with our submitted LOMR (Letter of Map Revision). We have already supplied FEMA with the current status of our property in this regard.

We tried to keep owners abreast of the situation with updates posted to <u>villatowers.net</u> and by replying to texts and emails as best we could with power and internet outages.





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Many thanks to our Board members and volunteers who helped secure our building for Irma—especially **Tom Bernat**, who employed our new Armor Screen system, along with Rob Saari, secured our new canopies to prevent them from getting ripped, secured many owner's shutters that were poorly secured, and cut down coconuts from all but our two tallest trees! And, after the storm Tom replaced the exit lights that were blown off or broken, as well as anything else that needed to be done. Again, thank you Tom! You are definitely our volunteer of the year!

COASI Update from Wayne Perrett —

"We definitely dodged a bullet."

Our beloved Villa Towers and Singer Island are recovering well from Hurricane Irma. Following mandatory evacuation, gas shortages, and curfews, we can be thankful to have been spared from disaster when so many people are suffering devastation and the loss of homes and businesses along the Gulf Coast, in the Keys, the Caribbean, and Houston. Thankfully, the loss of power and AC was the worst outcome for most of us. A lesser issue facing Singer Island residents and businesses was lingering cable/wifi outages.

Six days after Hurricane Irma, most of the neighborhoods on the island had restored power (81% of Riviera Beach residents and businesses lost power during the storm.) Among the biggest community challenges of the storm was the condemnation of the "Singer Yacht Club Condo" property after a wall blew out and the seawall breached allowing water to invade the facility. Demolition of the property is set to begin soon. The future of the site will be a new beautiful gateway community to Singer Island.

The most visible sign of Irma here was the damage to the landscaping - sheered palm trees, fronds everywhere, downed trees and bushes. The wind and salt air caused the leaves of trees and shrubs to turn dark and "crunchy," just like autumn leaves up north.



Multiple storms in the Atlantic have contributed a lot of vegetation to the beach. Once hurricane and turtle seasons are over, the beach can be raked by tractor.

Some of the Singer Island resorts had restored-power and re-opened after 1-2 weeks. Recovery efforts and reopening dates were delayed for the Hilton Singer Island Oceanfront, Palm Beach Shores Resort and Vacation Villas, and Marriott's Ocean Pointe.

Our beach, Phil Foster Park, and the John D. MacArthur Beach State Park reopened quickly. There were erosion issues along the beach, especially by the pump house at the inlet and along Palm Beach Shores, as well as further north by a few of the other high-rises. Sand blew into Villa Towers and many other beachfront properties, throughout parking lots, in swimming pools, across Ocean Drive, and along the walking path in Palm Beach Shores. We had a couple of our palms uprooted.

Our friends at the Loggerhead Marine life Center Sea turtle Hospital reopened after about a week following Irma. During that time, they took in dozens of rescued sea turtle-hatchlings from local beachgoers. Prior to the hurricane, 12 sea turtle-patients were evacuated to the Georgia Aquarium.
