Friendly Reminders for All Owners

New or long-time residents, we can all use some reminders! *Please remember:*

RENTALS:

- All rentals must be for a minimum of 2 months with a limit of 3 per year.
- Renters are limited to two persons per bedroom.

GUESTS:

- Unattended guest stays are limited to a maximum of 30 cumulative days per year.
- All seasonal owners, guests, renters, realtors, contractors and delivery personnel are required to sign in at the lobby desk to ensure against inappropriate/ unauthorized access to the building and grounds.

COMMON AREAS:

- Park in assigned parking spaces.
- Turn out lights when leaving a room or bathroom in our common areas.
- Bike room: Be considerate of other owner's property when removing or storing your bike in the bike room. Damage to other bikes has recently been reported. Space in this room is limited to 2 bikes per unit—on a first come, first serve basis. Bikes must be tagged with the owner's name/unit number. Unidentified bikes will be removed. Be reminded that you store your bikes in this room at your own risk.
- All owners should give a key to their storage lockers to the board in case of emergency. If not already done please do so. In the event that no locker key is submitted and an emergency occurs requiring access, owners will be charged for costs incurred to gain access.

WASTE:

- Be careful when using your garbage disposal. To prevent clogs in the building's plumbing system only discard soft items in your disposal.
- Do not throw large items, bottles or cardboard boxes in trash chutes. These damage the system and cause unnecessary costly repairs to chute.
- Dispose of bottles and cardboard in the designated recycling bins.

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• Bulk garbage: Call Waste Management at 561-547-4000 on Monday or Tuesday to arrange for a pick up on Wednesday morning. Get a confirmation number. Put your items out at the curbside on Tuesday evening.

PETS:

 Residents wishing to have a pet are required to submit a Pet Approval Form to the Board. Approval is at the discretion of the Board.



• Dog Owners: Please walk your dog to the <u>front</u> lawn, away from building, to do their business and of course, "SCOOP THE POOP."

SAFETY:

- In accordance with Fire Code, no items are permitted to be stored on walkways as these are exit routes.
- PLEASE TURN OFF MAIN WATER VALVES IN YOUR CONDO PRIOR TO LEAVING YOUR UNIT FOR MORE THAN 1 DAY.

- All Official Board Notices and letters will be emailed to Owners, unless no email address is listed. 
