

Highlights from Board of Directors Meetings

Concrete Repair Project—The largest Villa Towers project this year has been the concrete repair project. Crews began removing damaged areas on June 22nd and worked steadily throughout the summer. At this point, the project is substantially completed. The contractor expects to be finished by mid to late September. Upon completion of the concrete work, walkway painting will commence.

Mike Leach has overseen this project throughout the summer and Tom Holt was involved on a daily basis. Photos of various stages and areas are provided on page 2.

Air Conditioning—A new air conditioner was installed in May. City inspection was completed and passed on June 17th. A new duct and vent to lobby was installed to improve air flow and quality.

Landscaping—Annual pruning for hurricane preparation was completed in June. One of our palm trees on the east side was diagnosed with gamoderma. The palm was removed to minimalize spreading of the disease. The dune planting has been pruned and the pathway maintained.

Entrance Security Door Codes—Building security is the responsibility of every owner. Giving your code to renters, visitors, contractors should be kept to a minimum and door codes should be changed frequently. If your door code has not been changed recently (or ever!), please contact Cathy Gill with a new 3-digit code and she will update your code. All codes consist of 3 digits that are fixed + 3 digits that you can choose.


Preparing for a Hurricane—

Change is all around us

Construction Projects Around Singer Island

Construction has started on a new residential condo called **The Blue**, which is located between the Hilton and the Marriott Beach Resort and Spa. The building will be 18 floors with 58 units.

The **Amrit** property (between the Marriott Ocean Palms and Tiara), which has been idle since the 2008 economic crash, is now planning to start construction in early 2016. It will be called a **Wellness Resort & Spa** with two towers of 20 floors each, consisting of 150 resort hotel rooms and 209 resort hotel suites.



After a long hiatus, **Ocean Mall** is resuming their renovation with construction of the middle building now under way. The proposal shows this building's appearance is the same as the other two (pictured).

Singer Island Post Office Closed

The Singer Island Post Office that was conveniently located in Bank of America closed its doors earlier this summer. Faced with rising costs and declining volumes of mail, the Postal Service has been closing post offices where it makes sense. The Singer Island office is about 3.5 miles from Riviera Beach's main post office on Blue Heron Blvd. and Congress Ave. on the southeast corner.



Riviera Beach Marina Update

The \$375 million marina redevelopment has expanded to tentatively include a three-story public market for local farmers and fisherman, and to offer local artisans small retail space.



The redevelopment project is composed of a two-story convention center, marina upgrades, and bicentennial park, as well as residential, hotel, commercial and office space to be built in phases over 10 years. The first phase broke ground last year with Newcomb Hall and the Tiki Bar demolishment. The marina facilities have been upgraded as part of this first phase.

The project is being funded by federal, county, private and grant monies to both the city of Riviera Beach and the Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA). For more information: RBCRA marina project.


